### **Working for the Community**

#### WORKING FOR AGENCIES

**Emergency Baby Box**– EBB provides infant essentials, such as diapers and formulas, to agencies that serve families in need.

**Emergency Food Box**– EFB offers a nutritionally balanced food box, according to dietary, medical or religious needs, to agencies helping individuals, elderly, handicapped or families who find themselves in a temporary emergency situation.

**Back to School Supplies**– Back to school supplies are usually available on the last Saturday of July. Limited amount available; provided by AMWA.

**Gently Used clothing**– Gently used clothing are donated all year around. Baby, toddler, children, women and men of all sizes.

**Hygiene items**– Hygiene items of various kinds are donated throughout the year.



**Men's Interview cloths**– Limited Men's interview cloths available upon request.

#### *HOW YOU CAN HELP*

**Anyone can sustain the food banks' mission by providing:**

**FINANCIAL SUPPORT** - Dollars donated to the Food Bank, support the food bank, programs and food purchases.

**FOOD DONATIONS** - Non-perishable food items fill emergency food boxes year-round; as well as Frozen, packaged meats, baby food & formula.

**NON-FOOD DONATIONS** - Non-food items, such as diapers, wipes, powder, shampoo, toothpaste, soap and other types of toiletries/household cleaners, are a nice/necessary addition to emergency food boxes.

**VOLUNTEERISM** - Individuals and groups save Food Banks labor costs, while doing something wonderful for the community.
